#### I. Project Summary

Empire Biodiesel Initiatives will aim to promote the use of biodiesel for the transport of goods to an audience that is already aware of the benefits of supporting local and reducing emissions through transportation, such as a part of the mission of Food Miles. Food miles are understood to be the distance over which a food item is transported from its source to its final destination. *Effective Food Miles* are the item's food miles adjusted to take into account the carbon footprint of the vehicle(s) transporting it.

### **Work Summary to Date**

Work for this program has continued to focus on outreach and education program to ECC's network of stakeholders and members. A news blast was distributed to the entire ECC network, as well as a dedicated Facebook post. These article and social media post described ECC's partnership with NYCSGA with information on how biodiesel is made and its benefits as an alternative fuel source. Events were another part of our outreach efforts this quarter as Empire Clean Cities hosted a Clean Vehicle festival in Union Square Park on October 11th, 2018. This event highlighted the different types of alternative fuels ECC works with, including Biodiesel. The event reached over 200 people, despite poor weather and 30 individuals were added to the mailing list that includes future Empire Biodiesel Initiative e-blasts. ECC also continued its individual outreach by setting up meetings with Green Market/Grow NYC and Sprague Energy, two gatekeepers to potential end users of biodiesel. ECC will connect directly with the identified business and fleets identified through meetings in December 2018.

For the remaining portion of the grant ECC will meet with the 3 identified food and beverage fleets and businesses to encourage the use of soybean commodities in the form biodiesel. A case study will be developed based on these conversations. ECC will also continue its outreach through social media and engagement with stakeholders to increase education of Food Miles and the benefits of biodiesel through an additional e-blast.


